Growing for Kingdom Impact

Last December we kicked off Phase 1 of an ambitious project that will enable Woodcrest Retreat to become a year-round retreat facility. We look forward to offering programs that will allow us to fulfill our mission to introduce people to Jesus Christ and encourage Christian growth during all four seasons—not just summer.

The first phase was the completion of a new shower house for our overnight campers and expansion of our sewer lines.

Thanks to the generosity of our camp community, we received full funding for this project on April 12th (less than five months after launching the initiative) and had it ready for use by the opening day of summer camp. Even after a busy summer, it still smells new and looks great!

On September 16th, at our Fall Fest, we officially kicked off Phase 2 of our Mission 4:12 Campaign. This phase includes bringing in 10 Lancaster Log Cabins to provide up to 140 beds for year-round use. The total cost of Phase 2 is roughly \$1.8 million. Because of the continued generosity of our supporters, we were able to announce at the Fall Fest that we are already 25% funded for this phase. We obviously have a way to go, but we are excited to see how God is going to provide.

Our year-end letter will offer more information on this project and invite you to help us toward our goal. We look forward to the completion of this phase and the opportunity to grow God's Kingdom through life transforming programs and partnerships.

Woodcrest has been blessed to be able to serve more groups. In 2022, we served over 275 churches. We anticipate that we will serve more than that in 2023. Our facilities are busy with families and organizations holding events while our cabins are rented most weekends. That has led us to seek a person who has a passion for making guests feel valued and appreciated while keeping our facilities clean and welcoming. We are looking to hire a Hospitality Coordinator. This is a 16-24 hours per week position that includes housekeeping (cleaning facilities after guests leave), prepping facilities for incoming groups, guest group follow up, scheduling other housekeepers, plus other duties that will further our mission and ensure that groups have a positive experience at Woodcrest.
